Minor and Child Attending School issue – When the income of the custodial parent of a minor child far exceeds the income of the non-custodial parent and there is a child attending school considered, the calculator may change the obligation for the minor child to the parent with all or most of the parenting time. Social Security or Veterans benefits issue – When the amount of a non-custodial parent’s benefit to the child is significantly more than that parent’s support obligation would be, the calculator may incorrectly change the obligation to the custodial parent. Prior to 10/15/2013 the non-joint child credit was not working properly for parties with incomes of less than \$1000.
